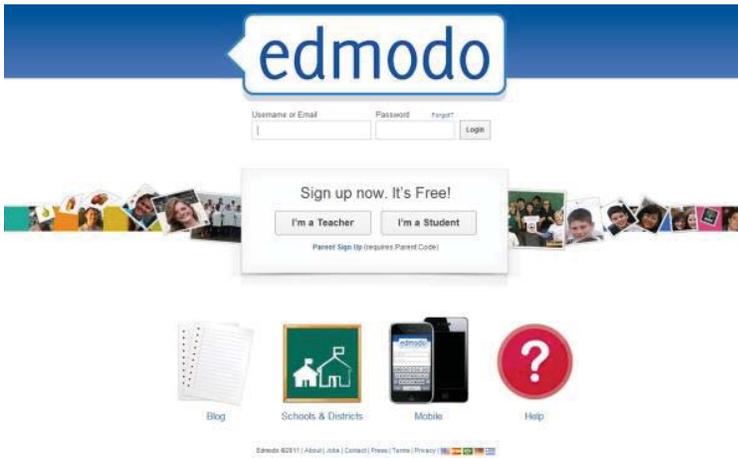


Using Technology for Language Learning

Using Edmodo to Increase Relevance in FL Instruction

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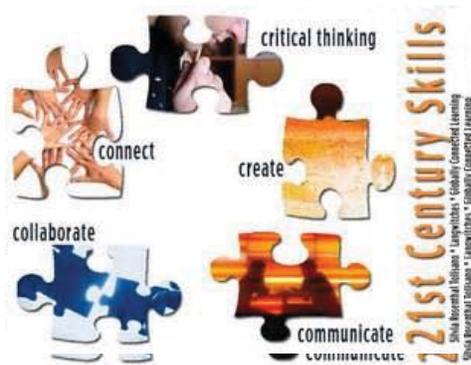


Edmodo provides a base to create excitement for your class through authentic engagement. It is 24 hour access to your teacher and your students. It is social learning. Edmodo is a great way to get students engaged and organized. It is free..... If you are new to Edmodo, it looks like Facebook so is easy to navigate and appealing. The website is www.edmodo.com.

A few advantages.....a teacher can post the agenda and handouts on the class page, with links to the wiki and other resources. Students can also post files or videos to

share. It's a great help when students are absent, as they can still access the class, get the agenda, and download any handouts. It becomes a paperless classroom.

Quick Benefits – Teaches 21st Century Skills. Allows for anytime/ anywhere learning. Allows for more participation.



Create a Teacher Lounge: teachers have a place to interact with coworkers, share ideas, and provide support. Planning committees can also meet online – teachers, students, parents and administrators can join.

Allows student collaboration: create groups for assessment, projects etc. All class documents are in one place, and homework is turned in electronically (all platforms).



7. Connect with another class - Whether they are native speakers or another class learning the same language but in another part of the same country, students will get excited about meeting new people. They will still be using the target language, which is the point, but their level of engagement may go up.

8. Provide guidance and answer homework questions – When students get stuck on assignments, they can post a question (in the target language, if possible). Often, other students will answer their questions before the teacher can. If it’s an upper level class, they can do all the communication in the target language. This kind of communication is entirely authentic and really helps the student with real world interactions.

9. Digitally file – Create folders for all documents, files, presentations, short videos, and projects for students to easily (and paperlessly) access from anywhere.

10. Extend the class – Use Edmodo to post cultural polls, quizzes and informational links to hook the students into material you never quite cover to your satisfaction. Have them create trailers and posters for or about the music, art, and traditions and post them in Edmodo. Make it a contest and poll for the winner of each category.



11. Role Playing – Help students understand key words, events, or stories by reenacting them through role playing activities. Students create profiles for relevant figures and integrate knowledge into action. This serves to inject life into old curriculum and helps students develop the skills of initiative, communication, problem solving, self-awareness, and working in teams.

12. Tutor connection – Communicate quizzes, assignments and tests with a tutor, either one on one or in groups. Ideas, content, and advice can be shared to further advance the potential of the students.

Edmodo has many uses from sharing resources to interacting with others. The resources can be used to flip your classroom. Edmodo can be used as a community-building platform with a secure and safe environment. It allows students and teachers to stay connected via sending notes, replying to posts and checking messages and upcoming events while away from the classroom.
